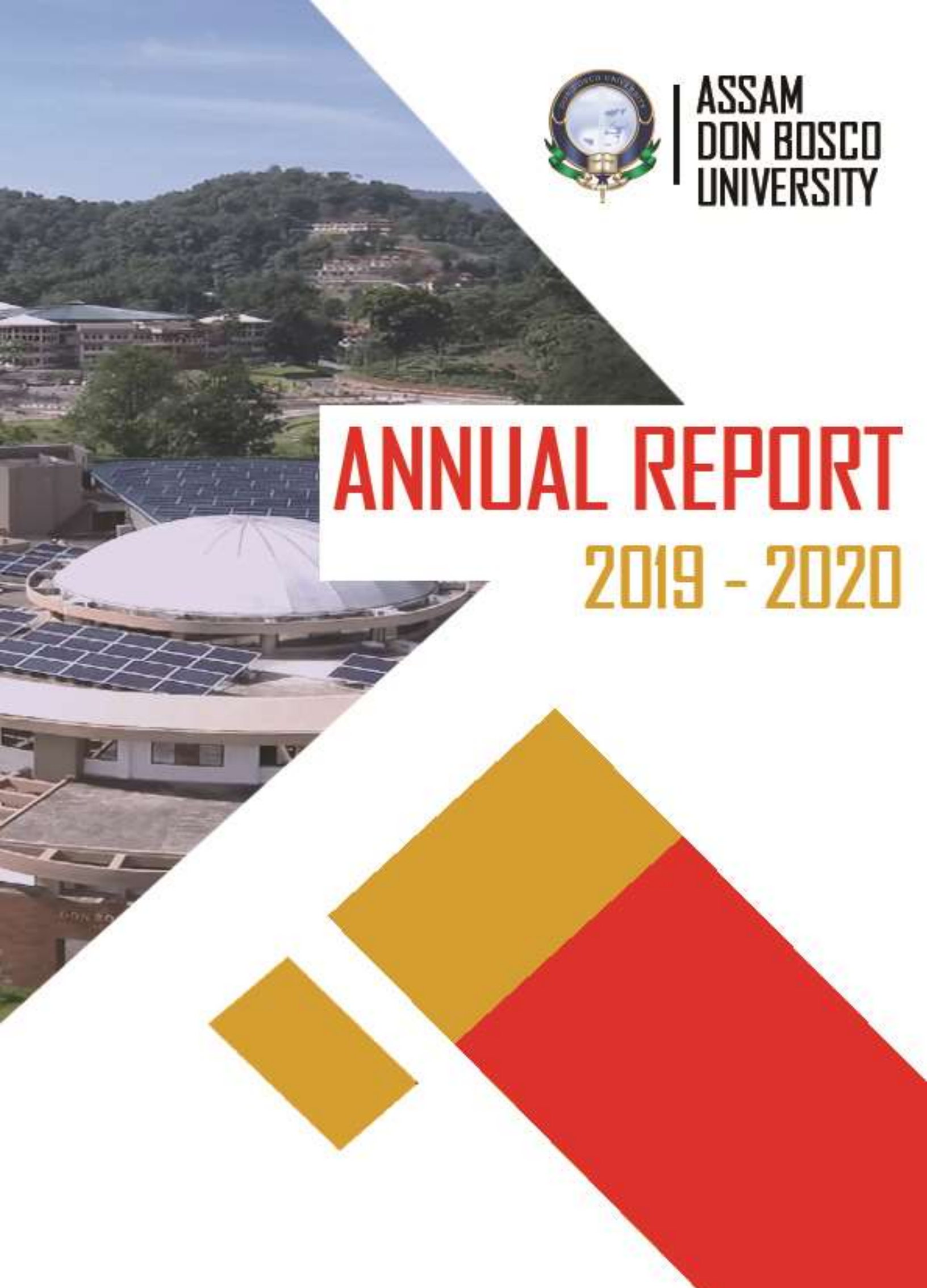

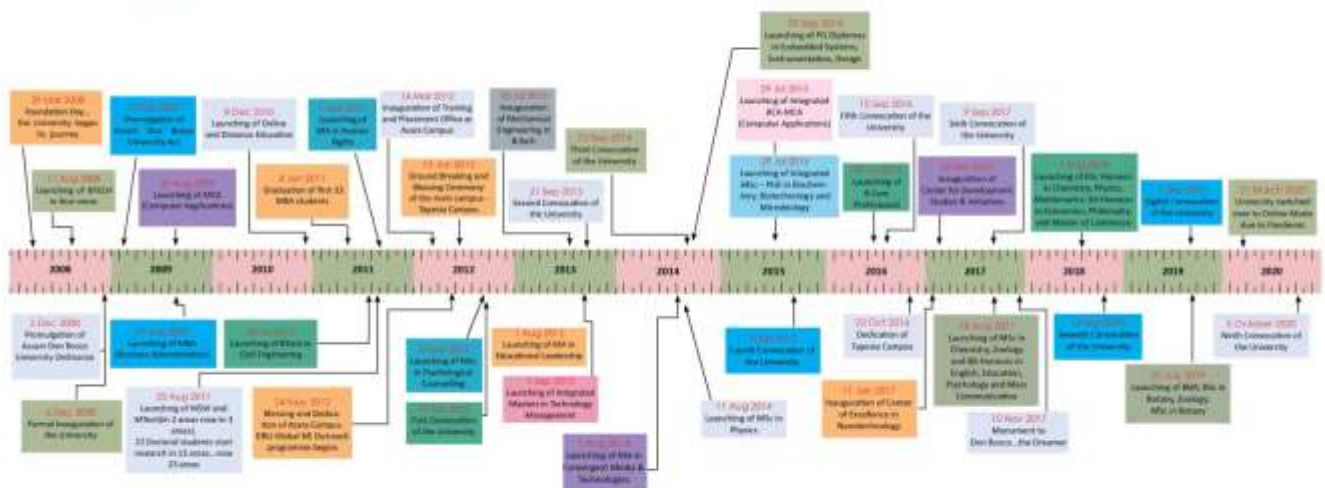

Without going into too many details, let me update you on some of the significant developments during the year.

In the field of academics, the University launched several new programmes on campus: a) Bachelors in Chemistry, Botany and Zoology, b) Bachelors in Business Administration, and c) Masters in Botany

All preparations have been completed for the introduction of the integrated 4-year Professional Teacher Education Programme (BA-B Ed, B Sc-B Ed, M Ed) once the National Council for Teacher Education completes the inspection.

Under DBU Global, our distance education wing, we have just been approved for the following Programmes of Study for the year 2019-20: Bachelor's in Philosophy, Business Administration, Commerce and Computer Applications, and Master's in Philosophy, Education, Human Rights, Mass Communication, Commerce, Social Work and Information Technology. They are being introduced in a phased manner.

As in previous years, this summer too saw incredible activity at all campuses of the University with an array of summer programmes (workshops, internships, conferences) organized by the various departments - Summer schools, summer workshops, crash courses, Internships – these have come to stay as a regular feature of life at the University.

Last month we hosted a Fulbright Scholar in Communication Media from Chicago (USA), this month we are initiating a 'Certificate Course in Neuropsychology' with the University of Parma (Italy), and next month we are organizing a Summer School in collaboration with Frankfurt University of Applied Sciences (Germany) on 'Human Rights for Social Development'.

Let me also share with you the proud news that, at the end of this month, we shall be hosting a Production Team from the BBC and the International Association of Universities to be featured in a documentary series on the Institutions of Higher Education raising the living standards of persons around their campuses through focused interventions in a variety of areas. We are one among 15 universities chosen from across the world to feature in this series.

In the area of research, the buzz word today is pervasiveness. The research culture has struck deep roots within the academic community of the University. 59% (155 out of 264) of the faculty have completed their doctorate, another 64 (24%) are actively pursuing their doctoral research in a variety of Indian and foreign universities. That is an enviable record for even-well established universities.

The tempo has picked up substantially also in the holding of seminars, conferences and workshops, 61 in a row this year alone. Our Faculty-Student ratio is a very healthy 1:10.2, much better than most of the old and established universities and well above the requirements of the statutory bodies.

It is also significant that the number of Papers published in journals of repute comes to a healthy 1.9 per member of the faculty. Most of these arise out of their areas of doctoral work or research projects. It is also gratifying to note that our undergraduate students have got into the act with several of their papers getting published.

It is also a matter of pride that we have today 317 research scholars, pursuing their doctoral studies across 23 disciplines – 12 of them are being awarded the Doctorate today in addition to 31 awarded at earlier convocations.

In the area of infrastructure development, a lot of developments have taken place at the Tapesia Campus – 4 new hostels (two each for men and women), a new water body spanning 6 acres, 2 kilometres of roads under development, Academic Block-IV with 17 new labs for Basic Sciences, over 5000 trees and saplings planted... Plans are afoot for the construction of Academic Block-V, two more hostels, an additional Food Court and 30 Staff Quarters.

The campus at Tapesia, apart from providing us with an enviable location for academic pursuits, is slowly developing into a nerve centre for the development of the entire region, especially the 42 villages that surround the campus. It is an ideal location for the packed extension and social commitment programmes of the University. It's in our plans to ensure that every graduate of our University will have committed themselves to several months of meaningful social work during the course of their study at the University.

Speaking of campus development, we are proud of our plantations (numbering over 20,000 trees over the years – rubber, agar, coconut, cashew, neem, cocoa). In the near future, apart from becoming alternative sources of income, they will also turn into demonstration farms and seed production centres for the National Boards, research avenues for the university into pest resistance, hybridization, and mass multiplication through tissue-culture, and an excellent training platform for our social outreach programmes in the villages.

Our water bodies, all seven of them, are brimming over with fish, including the anti-malarial variety that feed on mosquito larvae. Water harvesting is a given on the campus, with all the fresh water being corralled into the fresh water lakes.

The tea estate too is getting a new lease of life with a systematic conversion to organic farming and tea research. We have also started experimenting with the production of hand-rolled tea; eventually a tea factory will be in place to produce and package quality tea.

I am also happy to report that we have given a facelift to our Campus at Azara, raising the ground level to prevent the frequent waterlogging, and providing new boundary walls that showcase the beauty of the campus.

In the area of quality assurance, we hold the unique distinction of being the first university in the country being awarded a B+, among the 59 accredited universities to have been accredited by NAAC under the revised accreditation framework.

Our Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has been an active catalyst in setting precise objectives to be met, monitoring and documenting subsequent performance, and always keeping us on our toes and shifting the goal posts all the time. The NAAC Peer Team that visited the University categorically stated that the performance of IQAC in Don Bosco University is unparalleled in the whole country.

In the post-accreditation period, our Internal Quality Assurance Cell, IQAC, is channelizing the efforts and measures of the university towards academic excellence. The IQAC has been working actively as the think tank of the university, taking on the dual roles of initiator and monitor of all quality enhancement works of the university.

Major thrust of the IQAC in recent years has been in implementing the pedagogy of outcome based education and research throughout the university. Members of the IQAC function like the hubs in a spider's web that reach out to spread this message and insistence right across every process in the University.

Current Statistics on various parameters

2. In tandem with our concept paper, we have developed over the years a Strategic Development Plan of the University that keeps guiding us as we grow and develop.
3. We have a governance structure that ensures checks and balances and speedy implementation of all decisions... The autonomy that the Government of Assam has blessed us with has been a key factor in ensuring a speedy decision making process with a scrupulous adherence to norms.

5. We have in place a draft 'sustainability plan' for the university that takes seriously issues of financial stability and viability of the university for years to come. It is also a handy tool when scouting for funds for the university.

# About Assam Don Bosco University

## Introduction

The Assam Don Bosco University is the first University in the English speaking world of the worldwide family of the renowned Don Bosco Society present across 134 countries in service of the educational and developmental needs of 15 million young people. The University was set up by the Assam Don Bosco University Act 2009 under the State Private Universities Act of the Government of Assam, and was duly notified vide Government Notification No. LGL 149/2008/30 dated 12th February 2009. The University is authorized to award and grant degrees under the University Grants Commission Act of 1956, India, accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council, India and is approved by the Distance Education Council and the All India Council for Technical Education. The University is also a member of the Commonwealth Association of Universities (ACU) based at London since 18th October 2011, and of the International Association of Universities (IAU) based at Paris since 29th November 2011, and of the Association of Don Bosco Institutions of Higher Education (IUS) based at Rome since 2008.

The University has been set up as a response to the felt educational needs of the people of North-East India and offers relevant study programmes with a focus on research and social commitment through the Schools of Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences, Life Sciences, Applied Sciences, Commerce and Management. The University Centre for Online and Distance Education (CODE), called DBU Global, offers a variety of study programmes in Management and Information Technology. The University has also entered into a number of collaborative agreements with universities from around the world for student and staff exchange programmes and for joint research studies. Don Bosco University has evolved for itself a clear-cut vision that defines its rationale, objectives and approach to excel in teaching, formation of individuals by offering support, making students ready for quality placements at the three vibrant campuses at Tapesia, Azara and Kharguli. A sustained alumni association is established to carry forward lifelong learning of the students by partnership of the students with their alma mater.

## Vision and Mission of the University

Our vision, mission and values statement, our graduate attributes, and our achievements encapsulate what we stand for as a University and what we offer to students, staff and the wider community. We are committed to providing an education that cultivates a spirit of creativity and initiative and equips tomorrow's leaders and innovators; engaging community; maintaining diversity and inclusion among our students and staff; and providing equitable access to education.

- Boosting international linkages and collaboration in university education

## **Schools**

The Assam Don Bosco University started with four academic programmes of Engineering and Technology in 2008 and currently the University offers 19 graduate programmes, 19 postgraduate programmes and doctoral studies in 23 areas belonging to, the School of Technology, the School of Humanities and Social Sciences, the School of Commerce and Management, the School of Fundamental and Applied Sciences and the School of Life Sciences. To encompass the larger scope and vision of the University towards its commitment of building and operating a healthy and self-renewing, vibrant campus community with clear cut goals and priorities in the areas of education, clean energy, nature and eco systems, cutting-edge research and teaching in the latest technologies to tackle real issues of the region.

## Highlights of 2019-2020: A Diary of Events

### University signed 'Green Pledge' in collaboration with European Union, 5 June 2019



Assam Don Bosco University collaborated with the Delegation of the European Union and the European Union embassies in India to join the common fight against environmental degradation and agreed to follow the principles adopted by the EU embassies as part of the "EU Green Pledge" adopted by the EU missions in India on 5th June 2019. EU Green Pledge was signed by the Registrar, Fr.(Dr) Biju Michael on behalf of the University while Ms. Henriette Faergemann, First Counsellor, Delegation of the European Union to India signed the same on behalf of EU.

As a part of the initiative, the University agrees to make sincere efforts towards the following:

- Eliminate the use of single use plastic products wherever possible such as plastic straws, stirrers, cups etc. in the university campus and residences.
- Switch from plastic bags to other material such as paper, cloth or jute bags.
- Stop serving water in plastic bottles.
- Request hotels and conference facilities where we organize our events to follow these principles.

### National Workshop on Pedagogy for 21st Century Teaching and Research, 12-13 May 2019



A two-day national workshop on 'Pedagogy for 21st Century Teaching and Research' was held from 12-13 May, 2019 at the Azara Campus of Assam Don Bosco University.

The objective of the workshop was to provide an opportunity to the educators of Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) of the region to revisit their roles and redefine their teaching frameworks, make efforts towards adapting to the 21st century teaching methodologies, curriculum design and evaluation, and basic research skills for effective teaching-learning process. The workshop was organised by the Internal Quality and Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the University in collaboration with National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) as the academic partner. The resource persons for the workshop were Prof. P.K. Acharya, Department of Education, Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU), Itanagar; Prof. T. Lunghdim, Department of

Education, RGU, Itanagar; Prof. K.C. Kapoor, Department of Education, ADBU; and Dr. John Jose, Assistant Professor, Department of Computer Science and Engineering, IIT-Guwahati. The Resource persons gave insight into the areas of outcome based education model, student-centric effective teaching methodologies and learning designs, research and academic writing skills, curriculum design, and modern schemes of evaluation. 57 educators from across the country participated in the workshop.

### **Staff Development Programmes, 11-17 July 2019 and 8-14 January 2020**



Faculty Development Programme was conducted at Tapesia Campus before the start of the new academic year 2019-20, based on the theme 'Towards Catalyzing Design Thinking and Mindfulness' on 11-17 July 2019. The Resource Persons Professor Lata Chakravathy, Dean Faculty Development Centre (IIM, Shillong) , Dr. Sanjeeb Kakoty (Associate Professor at IIM Shillong) Ms. Sunita Bhuyan (Mumbai – a Violinist and Management Professional for Leadership and Change through Music) took turns in addressing the theme of the Faculty Development Programme

The University organized a second faculty development for one-week, a workshop on Service Learning during 8-14 January 2020 at Tapesia Campus. Prof. Andrew Carlson and Prof. Suzanne Walfoort from Minnesota State University, USA were the recourse persons for the workshop. During this workshop, the resource persons engaged the participants in different activities with an attempt to make them understand the values and importance of Service Learning.

### **International Student Exchange Programme 2019**



The sixth edition of the International Student Volunteer Exchange Programme, was conducted for over a one month. The Intercultural and Participatory Community Education and Development Programme between the University and University College Dublin Volunteers Overseas, Ireland, concluded on 13th July 2019.

This year, the Programme was implemented in the villages of Arabari, Barkhat No. 1, and Gojaiguri, under Sonapur, Assam. Some of intervention programmes included the implementation of:

- Awareness campaign on alcoholism, domestic violence and its effects on social and economic life
- Programmes and workshops which will enhance the community life of the people
- Organising weavers of the locality and setting up groups or a cooperative of weavers
- Intervention to enhance the functioning of the anganwadis - infrastructure and learning environment
- Adult literacy classes
- Language (English) enhancement classes to the students and youth
- Work with children, youth and women (clubs and groups formations)

- Health awareness programmes and campaigns
- Help in opening of Bank Accounts and facilitate in getting subsidized LPG connection.
- Training on Art and Craft for enhancement of livelihoods.
- Organise health/medical awareness and camps

## National Workshop on Research Publication and Intellectual Property Rights, 26 April 2019



The IPR Cell at Assam Don Bosco University belonging to the Board for Research, Innovation and Consultancy, ADBU in association with Patent Information Center, Assam Science Technology and Environment Council, Govt. of Assam organized a One day National Workshop on Research Publication and Intellectual Property Rights (WIPD 2019) on 26th April 2019 at Tapesia Campus.

The workshop brought together the UG, PG and Doctoral students from universities and Colleges to provide in-depth knowledge in the fields of IPR and research publications.

Addressing the gathering at the inaugural session, Dr. Arup Kumar Misra, Director, Assam Science Technology & Environment Council, Government of Assam spoke on the importance of innovation, saying, “Innovation does not mean re-inventing the wheel, but, using the wheel for the best purpose”.

The Vice Chancellor, Fr. Stephen Mavelly reiterated the University’s commitment to ‘research with social relevance’ and that a number of innovations that have come out from research at the University address the need of the common people. He added that ‘for such kind of research and innovation, sophisticated instruments and laboratories are not a necessity’. ## Postgraduate Students' Study Tour 2019, 11 - 16 April 2019



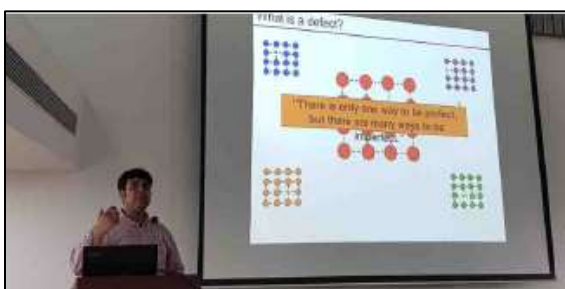

## Seminar: The Goodness of Imperfections: The Curious Case of Nanomaterials, 26 July 2019



On 26 July 2019 the Department of Physics, in collaboration with the Centre of Excellence in Nanotechnology (CoEN) at ADBU, had organized a seminar titled The goodness of imperfections: A curious case of nanomaterials. The special lecture was delivered by Dr. Ramakrishna Podila, a prolific researcher in the field of material science and who is the current Research Director at Clemson Nanomaterials Institute of Clemson University, South Carolina, USA. Students and faculty members across different departments of the university and other institutes attended the seminar which was held around 1:00 p.m. and 2:30 p.m. in the Auditorium of Academic Block I. During his talk, Dr. Podila put forward the case of the significance of imperfections and defects as a means to achieve novel phenomena and create enhanced materials. His talk was peppered with numerous demonstrations of projects undertaken by researchers in his lab, wherein "defects" in "ideal" materials were exploited to develop better and cleaner ways to generate and store energy, to develop better diagnostic tools and biosensors, to attempt in personalizing medicine and, most importantly, to unravel new fundamental physics. The intriguing yet engaging talk was followed by an interactive session where Dr. Podila responded to many questions and comments from members of the audience.

## Symposium on Schrödinger Picture 2019, 13 August 2019



The Department of Physics had organised the Symposium on Schrödinger Picture 2019 commemorating the 132nd birthday of Prof. Erwin Schrödinger on 13 August 2019 at 10:00 a.m. in the Auditorium of Academic Block I. A large number of participants from different departments of ADBU and other institutes had participated in the programme. Dr. Samrat Dey, the head of the department, in his introductory comments, mentioned that Schrodinger was a Nobel Prize-winning physicist who had developed a number of fundamental results in the field of quantum theory. Dr. Dey shared the astonishing trivia that James Dewey Watson, another Nobel Laureate, was actually inspired by Erwin Schrödinger's book *What Is Life?* and eventually went on to propose the famous double helix structure of the DNA molecule in biology. Prof. Poullose from the Department of Physics at IIT Guwahati, the invited speaker for this occasion, spoke on all these and other aspects of Schrödinger's life. Furthermore, Prof. Poullose also explained in details the intrinsic concepts of portions of quantum mechanics developed by Prof. Schrödinger. The symposium concluded after an interactive session between the audience and the speaker.

## School of Humanities and Social Sciences

### World Autism Day, 3 April 2019



To commemorate World Autism Day the Department of Psychology and Counselling in collaboration with Ashadeep Day Rehabilitation Center organised an exhibition cum sales programme on 3 of April 2019 at Assam Don Bosco University Tapesia Campus.

The objective for organising this programme was to create awareness about Autism as well as to help, encourage and support individuals who were recovering from mental illness through the fund raised from selling the items made by the individuals themselves and would be handed back to Ashadeep who in turn will use the money to support these people. Ashadeep is a center that caters to individuals with intellectual disability, associated disorders and persons recovering from mental illness. The Centre has a vocational unit that provides skill development training to the intellectually disabled adults and persons recovering from mental illness which forms a part of the therapy as well as a source of facilitating income generation. The event began with a brief talk about World Autism day during the morning Assembly which was followed by a seminar conducted by Dr. Sanghamitra Bora (State Lead – Palliative Care, Assam Cancer Care Foundation, Joint Initiative of Govt of Assam and Tata Trusts, Guwahati, Assam). Later in the day, three students belonging to MSc. Psychology and Counselling had an interview conducted by the department of Mass Communication of what Autism is and their experiences of working with an autistic child. This was broadcast by the Tapesia F.M. Radio during the afternoon session

### Substance Abuse Awareness Camp, 17 May 2019

The Community Counselling Cell of the Department of Psychology and Counselling, Assam Don Bosco University, Tapesia Gardens organized a Substance Abuse Awareness Camp on 17th of May, 2019. At the end of the programme, the MSc. Students conducted a self-evaluation screening test using- Michigan Alcohol Screening Test (MAST) for the participants which helped them gain an understanding about their level of problem drinking.

### **Street Play at Sonapur, 18 May 2019**



The Department of Mass Communication, Assam Don Bosco University carried out two street play performances on the 18th of May. The performances were delivered at two different locations of the same locality in Sonapur near its Tapesia Campus.

The first-year Mass Communication students were divided into two groups. ### **Inauguration of Community Computer Education Programme, 19 September 2019**



The University inaugurated its Community Computer Education Programme under Community Education Programme - education for sustainable development anchored by the department of Social Work, here today, 19 September 2019 in the presence of community children and university fraternity.

The project aims at creating and providing a platform and environment where community children and members can get access to E-education. The center especially targets the students of Government Schools around ADBU Sonapur campus; and envisages bridging the gap between theory and opportunity for practice on real computers of the government school children that teach computer lessons to students without computers. The students thus while attending theory computer classes in schools will get opportunity for practice with computers in the Computer Center at ADBU. The project 'aims at contributing towards sustainable Development Goals – Quality Education (SDG-4), Gender Equality (SDG-5), and Reducing Inequality (SDG-10)' according to Dr. Jacob Islary the programme coordinator.

The Computer center is housed in the University Service Center within ADBU campus. It has fifteen state of the art desktops that are able to handle – online and offline – basic to high end modules including programming, research and development oriented workshops and training. The first batch had 12 students and they have completed the course successfully; currently the second batch of 26 students and the third batch of 35 students attending the courses.

Speaking on the occasion Fr. Stephen Mavelly, Vice Chancellor, Assam Don Bosco University hailed the efforts of the team members for the project and recalled and expressed gratitude to University College Dublin Volunteers Overseas, Ireland for their 'collaboration with Assam Don Bosco University in actualizing the programme', and emphasised on 'the need for quality service to the community children if development is to be inclusive.' Certificates of completion were distributed to the 12 graduating students during the programme followed by refreshment for community children.

### **Certificate Course on Neuropsychology and its Applications, 30 September – 5 October 2019**

A Certificate Course on Neuropsychology and its Applications was organized by the Department of Psychology and Counselling in collaboration with experts from the University of Parma, Italy and Excel Hospital, Guwahati during 30th September – 5th October 2019 at Tapesia Campus.



In his keynote address, Prof. Roberto Ravera, Founder and Director of Ravera Children Rehabilitation Center, shared his experience of dealing with children in Africa who had been traumatized, neglected and faced abuses of various levels. He emphasized on the study of trauma from the neuropsychology perspective where there are many new challenges as the society changes. He also reminded that, psychology is a heuristic science where the complexities of human thoughts, emotions and behaviors are influenced and changed by environment and a new avenues of research and studies are open up to understand that complexities. He encouraged the participants to go out of the box and experience the complexities of human world and contribute our effort in bringing about a change for the wellbeing of human life.

Dr. Virginia outlined on the aims and objective of the course. The main aim of the course was to understand how the genetic makeup of a person influences and changes the psychological as well as the physiological aspect of a person. By understanding the anatomical and functional aspect of the nervous system, one can understand the causes of various mental illnesses as well as their behaviors, thus the course is undertaken to highlight the relationship of the human body and environment in the wellbeing of a person.

Fr. Biju Michael gave a concluding remark by sharing that ethics take reverse approach to neuropsychology in the understanding of human cognitions and behaviors. He also mentioned about the relation of human intelligence with emotional intelligence in the way we process our thoughts and connecting it to feelings.

During the one week course, various lectures and discussions on child development and developmental disorders, state of mind, mindfulness, self-control, mentalization, nature and nurture, nervous system of the human body, anatomical systems, biological systems, genetic clusters, trauma and attachments etc were held. These lectures were conducted by Professor Roberto Ravera and Dr. Virginia Ravera. On the last day Dr. Anweshak Das (Consultant Psychiatrist) discussed about the 'The Bridging Gap of Neuropsychiatry and Neuropsychology'.

The course was attended by 44 participants from various parts of India.

### **Guest lecture by Dr. Subudhi, NEHU, Tura Campus, 8 November 2019**



Dr. S.C. Subudhi, Associate Professor, Department of Education, North Eastern Hills University, Tura Campus, West Garo Hills Meghalaya, visited Department of Education Assam Don Bosco University on 8 November 2019 and had small interaction with the PG students. He enlightened the students and the faculty members on the need of the hour type of education which is known as Invisible Education. ## School of Life Sciences

### Industry – Academia Interaction Programmes, 3 April 2019



A One day Symposium on “Funding opportunities for research grants and higher studies in India and abroad” was organised by the department of Bio Sciences on 3 April 2019 so as to bring opportunities to all the students as well as the faculty members. The symposium was held at Tapesia Campus. The gathering was enlightened on various opportunities that are available for obtaining funding for the purpose of carrying out meaningful research for the benefit of the humanity and the real problems that need intervention of proper research.

### A one-day workshop on ‘Mushroom for the people: Issues and opportunities’, 8 April 2019



A one-day training program on mushroom cultivation, “Mushroom for the people: Issues and opportunities” was organized by the Department of Life Science for local farmers, on 8 April 2019 as a part of an activity of Vita Scientia Club.

Prior to this, students had undergone a twenty-five-day training programme to learn the steps of cultivation and to be able to give training to the local farmers around the University in the month of March, under the supervision and guidance of Dr. Monika

Soni, Asst. Professor in the Department. Mr. Mohan Sharma, Chairman of USHA (NGO) was invited on 8th of March to provide hands-on training to the students on Oyster (*Pleurotus* spp) mushroom cultivation.

During this training, students learned about the nutritional, medicinal, economic, environmental, and ecological benefits of this particular mushroom and also cultivated it themselves. After twenty five days of the training, there was a successful production of an adequate quantity of mushrooms. Students were encouraged to find a market for selling their products, which was part of encouraging and developing entrepreneurial skills among the students. Oyster mushroom is the third most commercially cultivated mushroom globally.

### **Field Trips, 31 March – 1 April 2019, 11 - 18 April 2019**



A field trip was organized for the second semester Students to Manas National Park from the 31 March to 1 April 2019. The trip was accompanied by two faculty members of the Department. Two separate field trips were also organized for the Final Semester students to Shillong and Mumbai. The students specialized in Fish and Fishery Biology visited Mumbai while those specialized in Cell and Molecular Biology and Animal Ecology and Wildlife Biology visited Shillong. The students were accompanied by faculty members of the

Department. The Shillong trip was organized for two days, 8 and 9 April while the Mumbai trip was organized from the 11 to 18 April 2019. The objective of the fields trips were to enhance the learning experience of the disciplines students study in their study.

### **Bioinformatics Workshop, 7 – 8 May 2019**

A two-day workshop on “Short term Training in Bioinformatics” was organized by NIELIT for the students of the Department on the 7th and 8th May 2019. Sangma, on the 17th and 20th May. The students learnt the use of Clinometer and Densiometer from the volunteers.



### **Workshop on Turtle Biology, 11-12 June 2019**



A two-day workshop titled, “Let’s Talk Turtles” was jointly organized by the Department of Zoology, Assam Don Bosco University, Assam State Biodiversity Board, Turtle Survival Alliance, and Help Earth on 11-12 June 2019 at Tapesia Campus.

The workshop was designed to imbibe an interest in Turtle biology among the participants and building capacity of the

youth in turtle conservation. Topics covered in the workshop included turtle taxonomy, turtle biology, legal aspects, molecular taxonomy, turtle survey methodology etc. The resource persons of the workshop were experts in the field in turtle biology including Dr. Shailendra Singh of Turtle Survival Alliance, Dr. Saibal Sengupta of Assam Don Bosco University, Dr. Rajeev Basumatary of D.R. College and Dr. Madhurima Das from IBT Hub, Arya Vidyapeeth College and Dr. Jayaditya Purkayastha from Help Earth. During the workshop, turtle taxonomy, turtle biology, legal aspects, molecular taxonomy, the turtle survey methodology was addressed. A special session on threatened species of Assam notified U/S 38 of Bio- diversity Act of 2002 was conducted by Dr. Oinam Sunanda Devi, Scientific Officer in Assam State Biodiversity Board. The program was inaugurated by Fr. (Dr.) Francis Fernandez, Controller of Examinations, Assam Don Bosco University, Dr. Shailendra Singh of Turtle Survival Alliance and Dr. Prasanta Kumar Choudhury, Head of the Department, Department of Zoology, Assam Don Bosco University. Researchers and Research students from Cotton University, Gauhati University, ICAR, Assam Don Bosco University and NGOs' participated and benefited. Assam is home to 20 species of turtles making it the most species-rich state in India in terms of turtle diversity but unfortunately, 70% are threatened with extinction.

### **Health Camp by Vita Scientia, 12 November 2019**

Vita Scientia Club (Department of Bioscience) organized a health camp on 12 November 2019 at Tapesia Campus in collaboration with ExcelCare Hospitals Guwahati. The team from ExcelCare consisted of Dr. PK Das, two nurses, a medical executive and an assistant.



The aim of the programme was to extend the health services to the village communities around the University and also for the supporting staff of the University. The Health check-up activities included monitoring of Blood Pressure, Blood group, Height/Weight, random sugar and medical history. The check-up was held for 80 people including students, local men and women and also some faculty members. During the health check-up there were certain participants who required immediate medical attention and were referred to further diagnosis by the doctor. The programme was seen as a huge success for students and for the community people

### **World Animal Day 2019, 4 October 2019**

The Department of Zoology, in collaboration with the Eco Club, joined the thousands of other organizations and individuals around the globe in celebrating World Animal Day on 4th October, 2019. The Department is proud to support this global movement to raise the status of animals by using this special day to raise awareness about how our actions, as Homo sapiens, in one way or the other, affect the animal kingdom. The event is a global celebration for all animals and the people who love and respect them. The event started with an inspiring thought-sharing session by Liza Changkakoti, First Semester Student, at the morning Assembly. The talk revolved around the idea that today nature is in trouble



because of our actions, and how every tiny step taken by every individual can make a significant difference.

Two competitions were held for the day: Debate and Extempore Speech. The Debate competition sparked a vigorous discussion on “Scientific Collection as a barrier towards Conservation” among the debaters. The participants at the Extempore Speech competition displayed immense enthusiasm in relaying their thoughts on topics given to them. Further, the speaker assured that Bulk consumers, such as Don Bosco University, can manage the e-waste through the Karo Sambhav organisation which will ensure environmentally sound management of e-waste. The session concluded with an interactive quiz and a word search competition that enlivened the environment among the audience. The University received a Certificate of Appreciation from the Organisation.

forging processes, where material is removed from a stock item (subtractive manufacturing) or poured into a mold and shaped by means of dies, presses and hammers. The term "3D printing" covers a variety of processes in which material is joined or solidified under computer control to create a three-dimensional object, with material being added together (such as liquid molecules or powder grains being fused together), typically layer by layer. The training program was coordinated by Mr. Pallav Gogoi, Assistant Professor from the Department of Mechanical Engineering.

# Research Activities of ADBU in 2019-2020

## Course Work 2019

The Course Work for the 2019 batch began on 25th March, 2019 with 70 (seventy) newly admitted Research Scholars. Of the 70 (seventy) Research Scholars, 43 (forty three) were from the School of Humanities and Social Sciences, and 27 (twenty seven) were from the School of Science and Technology. At the start of the Course Work a short Introductory Session was organized with Prof. Pawan Sharma and eminent Scientist from DBT, New Delhi as the keynote speaker. The pledge of the Doctoral Scholars on “integrity, pursuit and safety” was administered by the Registrar of Assam Don Bosco University, Dr. (Fr.) Biju Michael.

A week long intensive class on research methodology was conducted with resource persons from within the University, with Prof. K.C. Kapoor and Dr. Uzzal Sharma as the principal course teachers respectively for the School of Humanities and Social Sciences, and Science and Technology. On completion of the week long classes, the Research Scholars were put into contact with their respective departments for the Subject Specific activities and concerns. The Research Scholars were continuously monitored by their respective departments and by the principal teachers of the Course Work through numerous assignments. Since the completion of the intensive classes a Research Scholar was expected to submit 3 (three) assignments from the respective departments, 3 (three) other assignments for Research Methodology and other assignments - Quantitative Tools for Humanities and Social Sciences, Latex for Science and Technology, and Biostatistics for Biosciences. All these assignments were closely monitored and were subjected to evaluations.

In addition to the assignments, the Research Scholars were simultaneously engaged in review of literature under the supervision of their respective supervisor(s). A report of the Review of Literature was submitted through the guide by the Researcher which was subjected for evaluation. On completion of all the assignments and Review of Literature the Research Scholars were invited for classes, examination and Presentation of Review of Literature.

Following the Literature review, the Research Scholars were put to written examination as per the University regulation for Ph.D. Course Work requirements. The examinations conducted were on Subject specific and Research Methodology. The written examinations carried a weightage of 40% while the assignments carried 60% weightage.

Likewise, the Review of Literature with the report submitted through the research guide as an assignment while the student is off campus, but presentation of the Review of Literature in person while in campus. However, unlike the Subject Specific and Research Methodology papers, the Review of Literature distribution of mark was 50% weightage for the report of the Review of Literature and 50% weightage for the Presentation.

On completion of all the requirements and examinations, the Ph.D. Course Work Examination was declared on 01/11/2019. As per the regulation of the Assam Don University candidates securing 60% and above / CGPA of 6 and above out of 10 were declared successful. The pass percentage of the batch for 2019 Ph.D., Course work was 97.14%.
